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Dear Student,

Eötvös Loránd University (ELTE) is a pioneering Hungarian public research university based in Budapest. Founded in 1635, it is one of the culturally richest and most prestigious institutions of Hungarian higher education. The University boasts five Nobel laureates, as well as winners of the Wolf Prize, the Fulkerson Prize and the Abel Prize. ELTE comprises nine faculties, located in various parts of Budapest, including the scenic banks of the Danube.

The Faculty of Humanities is the oldest and most comprehensive faculty of its kind in the country. During its more than 380 years of history, it has gained an outstanding reputation internationally, which is also demonstrated in the faculty rankings. It has been Hungary's number one university faculty for more than ten years. It has also performed particularly well in the Arts and Humanities, especially in Archaeology,

Linguistics, English Language and Literature, and Modern Languages in the QS World University Rankings.

Our faculty offers a dynamic and vibrant study environment, intended to inspire the next generation of global citizens. Internationalization is a strategic aim of the faculty, so we provide opportunities for students to take part in our professors' international research projects, to study abroad, to learn foreign languages and to combine their academic studies with work experience through placements and internships. We strive to be a truly "international faculty."

Currently we have approximately 600 international students, representing over 60 different nations on campus – so we can be considered a real global community. Almost 200 of these students study here on Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarships. There are also hundreds of students who come here through **exchange programmes**, or who study abroad within the framework of the Erasmus exchange programme, the Visegrád Fund, Campus Mundi, CEEPUS or bilateral agreements. The faculty has active agreements with over 300 Erasmus+ partner institutions in 30 different countries.

Whether you are considering an undergraduate major, a Master of Arts degree or a PhD, or a foundation course in English, German or Hungarian, you will find many of your questions answered on our website (btk.elte.hu/en/).

Our educational vision in the new millennium extends well beyond the gates of our campuses: we recognise that no duty can be more important than that of using our resources to teach young people, be it on a local or a global level. We are genuinely and seriously committed to this goal.

We offer about 50 study programmes, from pre-university foundation courses through BA and MA to the PhD level, where we offer more than 70 programmes. Our aim is to equip our students with the skills and competences they need to become global citizens and succeed in the international job market. In a world which is ever more interlinked and globalized, we are constantly faced with local and global challenges. We therefore intend to train global citizens, with

the necessary global competences to deal with local, global and intercultural issues and engage in appropriate interactions with people from different cultures. We teach the largest number of languages and their respective cultures in Europe, altogether 70 languages.

Most foreign students join our English foundation course, the English and American BA, the Communication and Media Studies MA or the Film Studies MA programme. The English Foundation Course is for students who wish to study at ELTE or another European university, but do not yet have the necessary language and study skills to start a BA programme. We also have a Hungarian Foundation Course, designed to enable participants to pursue an academic or professional life in Hungary.

We offer BA programmes in English and American studies, in Romance Languages and Cultures (where students can specialize in French, Italian, Portuguese, Spanish, and Romanian). We also offer a BA in Germanic studies, where students can focus on German, Scandinavian, or Netherlandistic studies. And, of course, we advertise a BA in Hungarian studies. These programmes are for those who wish to develop their competence in the respective languages and in inter-cultural communication in a scholarly or business environment. Students also learn the foundations of critical thinking and practical research.

For those who wish to further enhance their knowledge in these fields, we offer 2-year MA programmes in almost 20 different fields, including modern languages, but also specialist areas such as Archaeology, Assyriology, Buddhism, Cultural Heritage Studies, Central European Studies, Film Studies, Indology, Logic and Theory of Science, Philosophy or Semiotics. Our programmes have a strong theoretical base but also offer small-group, practice-oriented seminars which provide opportunities for interaction, cooperation, project work and for creating personal contacts with the teachers. International students interested in studying to become English language teachers can join our new 1-year English language instructor MA programme.

The faculty's diverse offering of subjects makes it a unique doctoral centre in the country and in the whole of Central Europe. Our 74 PhD programmes are organised into four larger units, known as Doctoral Schools: the Schools of History, Philosophy, Linguistics, and Literary Studies.

ELTE's Faculty of Humanities is also an excellent place to conduct research. The faculty actively participates in national and international collaborations funded by the European Union or the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. Talented students may participate in such projects in cooperation with their tutors.

We are proud to have a major library, with specialized collections of resources, books and journals. It is part of the Electronic Information Service National Programme, which allows access to a large number of scientific databases.

With students from all over the world, we have a beautiful, historical, lively and truly multicultural campus, with excellent public transport in the heart of Budapest and in the heart of Central Europe. As many of our students come from distant places with different educational backgrounds we provide plenty of support in adjusting to the learning environment at ELTE and in Budapest. There is a very helpful student mentor system in place, and our institutes and departments, as well as our teachers and professors, are also very supportive if students encounter difficulties.

Students and teachers regularly come together to organize cheerful social, sporting and cultural events and parties to help make new friends and acquaintances, and to make integration into this unique new environment easier. Learn about our people – our gradually expanding portfolio, our dedicated students, our renowned faculty, and our incredible global network of alumni. Our ambition is to become one of the world's leading humanities faculties.

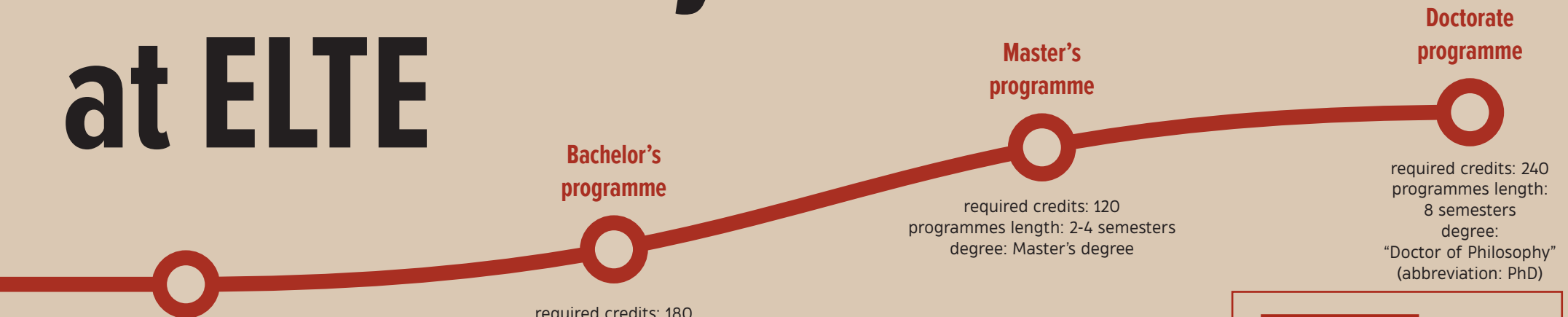

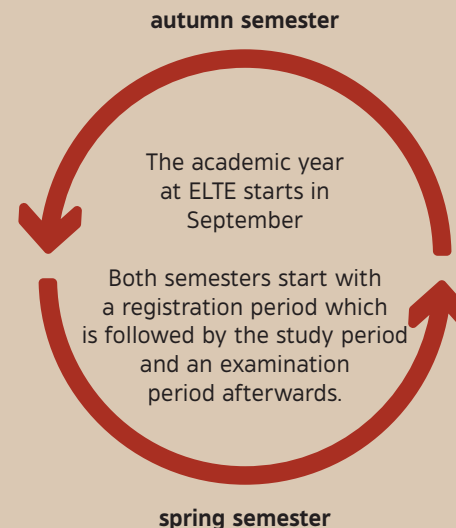

ECTS CREDIT SYSTEM

The ECTS conversion table ensures transfer procedures between the Hungarian academic credit system and the ECTS. The recognition of courses completed abroad is based on the credit transfer regulation. For incoming international students, a Transcript of Records is issued at the end of the semester, which contains the codes and titles of the completed courses, credits, their grades, and ECTS-compatible grades.

English Foundation Course

THE ENGLISH FOUNDATION COURSE HAS BEEN DESIGNED FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE ALREADY AT A CEFR A2 LEVEL IN ENGLISH AND WISH TO STUDY AT ELTE OR ANOTHER EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY, BUT DO NOT YET HAVE THE NECESSARY LEVEL OF LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY OR STUDY SKILLS TO PURSUE A BA DEGREE PROGRAMME. WITH A MINIMUM OF 800 CONTACT HOURS GUARANTEED, THE ENGLISH PREPARATORY YEAR CAN BRING YOU UP TO SPEED IN AS LITTLE AS TWO SEMESTERS.

Language improvement

This is the core element of the programme, with a general course in language improvement, focusing on the basic skills of speaking, writing, listening and reading. To prepare you to use English for study purposes, there are also specialised courses in the accurate use of English grammar and vocabulary, as well as academic reading and writing, and classes on the presentation and discussion skills needed for participation in seminars.

Study skills

Our teachers are there to help you, but you need to develop independent study skills for your future academic and professional career. You will attend courses designed to improve your ability to work on your own, with skills such as setting goals, managing time and monitoring progress. Your teachers will also set assignments to be completed through individual study and advise you about available resources.

Cultural studies

It is impossible to use a language without understanding the culture that surrounds it. The programme includes courses on the major English-speaking cultures in the British Isles and North America. Other courses cover aspects of European culture in general, as well as the culture of your host country, Hungary.

Goals

Students should be able to pass the CEFR B2 level language proficiency exam offered by the University at the end of the academic year. Passing the exam will gain students admission to ELTE's English and American Studies BA programmes, and programmes in other subjects taught in English. They may be admitted into another higher education institution of their choice in Hungary or the European Union depending on the language requirements of the other institution.

First semester intensive course

The course aims to equip students with the tools needed to successfully manage communicational situations arising in the target language environment, and to understand factual texts containing the basic structures of the language, in both reading and writing.

Second semester intensive course

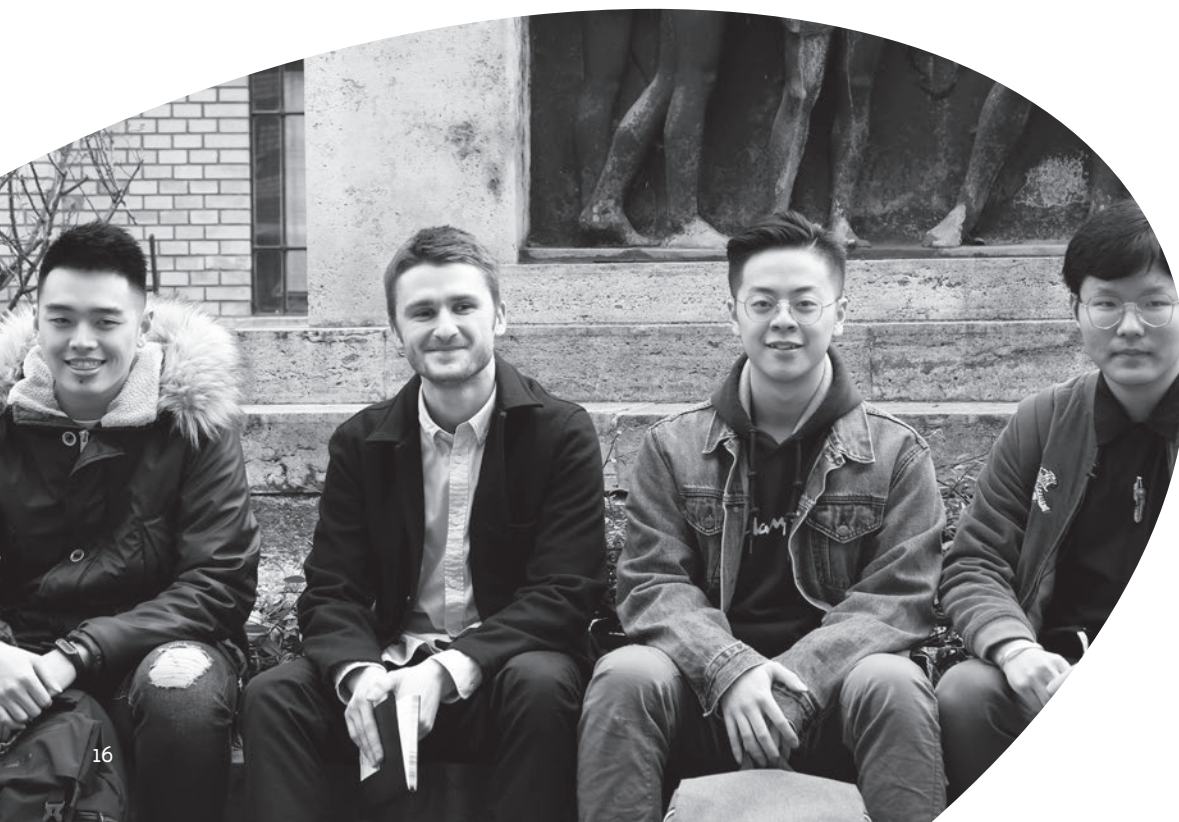
The course provides students with the full formal system of the Hungarian language. The course subjects, aimed at developing the various language skills, now concentrate on areas such as independent written compositions and language use for expressing opinions. The reading programme gradually leads from understanding texts with the help of a dictionary up to the independent processing of texts. The latter subjects can be expanded by developing the basic vocabulary according to the students' wishes into such areas as history, literature, sociology, etc.

The language proficiency acquired by the end of the course allows students to use the language for specific purposes, enabling them to continue their university studies or to use Hungarian as an intermediary language at work.

Doctoral programmes

The Faculty of Humanities launched its first doctoral programmes in 1993. We offer 74 accredited doctoral programmes in all fields of study within the humanities. The diversity of the subjects that may be studied here makes the faculty a unique doctoral centre in the Central European region. The PhD programmes are organised into four doctoral schools.

Students work on their dissertation topic under the guidance of a supervisor, an established member of Hungarian and international academic life. The doctoral programmes aim to endow the students with the research methodology needed for an academic career, and help develop their qualities as teacher and researcher.

By fulfilling the publication requirements, students become part of international academic life. International agreements between universities and the diverse international academic relations of supervising teachers provide outstanding students with the opportunity to partake in foreign research programmes, or to complete their doctoral studies in a so-called Co-tutelle arrangement (double doctoral degree scheme).

Doctoral schools frequently organise conferences, which serve as an excellent forum for talented students to present the results of their independent research, and to develop the academic skills indispensable for a future academic.

Talent management

Scientific Students' Associations

All academic branches taught at the faculty have their own Scientific Students' Associations (in Hungarian TDK), which provide an organised framework for students' individual and group research activities. These associations give talented students the chance to conduct far more in-depth research activities than within their regular university studies and write and debate research papers under the supervision of teachers specialising in the given field. Students who put together the best papers get to take part in the biennial National Conference of Scientific Students' Associations. The best papers are published in the faculty's publications and scientific journals, helping their authors gain admission to a doctoral programme and to eventually become recognised figures in academic life.

Colleges for advanced studies

The oldest college for advanced studies is Eötvös József Collegium founded in 1895, whose history is closely tied to that of the faculty. Talented students can get here the chance to immerse themselves in the research of a field of their choosing beyond their university studies.

Tutoring

Tutoring gives students a chance to take part in one-on-one study sessions with an instructor of their choosing, allowing for a more intensive and immersive exploration of the given subject matter.

Honorator status

The honorator status is the highest level of individual talent management. It entails taking on an additional minor or specialisation for a total of 50 credits free of charge beyond the mandatory minor or track comprising 180 credits. In addition, the faculty has established the Student Excellence Scholarship through which the Master's programme student deemed the most outstanding among their peers is awarded significant financial support with a view to enhancing their academic activities and professional advancement.

Research

ELTE's Faculty of Humanities is also a great place to conduct research. The faculty actively takes part in national and international collaborations funded by the European Union or the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. Talented students may participate in such projects in cooperation with their tutors.

The establishment of the research centres has allowed the Faculty to put its existing academic resources to use in an organised manner.

The faculty promotes bi- and multilateral international educational and research collaboration with the region's and the world's leading higher education and research institutions. We strive to become a leading centre of humanities research

within the Central European region. The instructors of the faculty's 18 institutes regularly travel abroad and host their international colleagues at home. They regularly organise international academic conferences and, by sending their students abroad, ensure that the future generations of researchers and instructors receive high-level training with an international outlook. Our instructors foster personal working or consultative relationships with university tutors and research centre staff from 40 countries, many of whom are involved in the editorial processes of renowned international academic journals.

Libraries in the service of research

Our library network – comprising the Central Reading Hall and the individual libraries of the various institutes – holds 1.2 million individual documents; a rarity not just in a domestic, but also in an international comparison, as only the most reputable institutions can boast such collections. The faculty's imposing special collections, the works of its past professors and renowned academics, its private libraries, museum pieces (globally unique incunabula, manuscripts and records), its own periodicals (scientific journals, almanacs), doctoral dissertations, non-traditional documents (score sheets, photos) are indisputable treasures of Hungary's cultural heritage. Many of the faculty's collections also function as national reference libraries. In addition to providing traditional library services, the library network also helps enhance research and education at the faculty by providing access to the major humanities and social sciences article databases like JSTOR or ERIC.

Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme

Hungarian universities and colleges attract thousands of international applicants each year. The number of Stipendium Hungaricum applicants as well as the number of available scholarship places are continuously on the rise. Every year, more than 5,000 students begin their studies in Hungary within the framework of the Stipendium Hungaricum Programme.

The programme is based on bilateral educational cooperation agreements signed between the ministries responsible for education in the sending countries/territories and Hungary or between institutions. Currently around 80 Sending Partners are engaged in the programme throughout 5 different continents and the geographical scope of the programme expands each year.

After you receive your 'Letter of Acceptance', please confirm your decision in the online application system, stating that you would like to enrol in the programme.

Required English proficiency

ALL OUR MID-LEVEL PROGRAMMES (BACHELOR AND ABOVE) REQUIRE APPLICANTS TO SUBMIT PROOF OF LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE FOUNDATION COURSE IN ENGLISH

Recommended minimum level of English: A2 level of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference), i.e. a minimum of approximately 250 hours of previous studies;
For the Foundation Course in English, no language certificate is required, but

meeting the above requirement is strictly the applicant's responsibility, as he or she will be asked to take a proficiency test at the beginning of their preparatory year. Should the student fail to meet this minimum requirement, he or she will not be able to follow the classes.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS FOR BA AND MA PROGRAMME APPLICANTS

Every international student applying for an English-medium study programme (Bachelor-level or higher) must show proof of a certain level of English language proficiency.

NATIVE SPEAKERS

Students from countries whose official (first or de jure) language is the language of tuition are exempt from the above language exam requirements. Instead of the required language certificates listed above, students must present an official, notarised document, stating that English has been the medium of their tuition throughout their high school and/or university studies.

Frequently Asked Questions

WHAT FACTORS ARE CONSIDERED WHEN MAKING ADMISSION DECISIONS?

You have better chances of being accepted if you received high grades (GPA) during your high school studies or an undergraduate (BA or BSc) degree with “excellent” or “good” qualifications (in accordance with the Hungarian higher education system).

WHAT IS THE TUITION FEE?

This depends on which programme you wish to follow. Information regarding tuition fees can be found on our website: BTK.ELTE.HU/EN

WHAT IS THE DEADLINE FOR PAYING MY TUITION FEE?

If you require a visa to come to Hungary, we strongly advise you transfer the fee to the university's account as soon as possible after receiving your letter of acceptance. The local Hungarian embassy or consulate is likely to issue your visa only if the tuition fee has been settled in advance.

Please only transfer the tuition fee to the university's account after you have been accepted onto one of our programmes. If you are a European Economic Area (EEA) national, the Faculty requires you to pay the tuition fee up to one semester in advance.

I AM A CITIZEN OF AN EEA STATE; DO I REQUIRE A VISA TO STUDY IN HUNGARY?

No, you do not, but you might be required to apply for a registration card depending on the length of your stay: Citizens of states belonging to the European Economic Area (EEA) are entitled to enter the territory of the Hungarian Republic in possession of a valid identity card or passport and are allowed to stay for up to 90 days, without any special authorisation. EEA citizens planning to stay for more than 90 days in Hungary must apply for a registration card.

WHERE CAN I FIND OUT MORE ABOUT THE LEGAL REQUIREMENTS I HAVE TO COMPLY WITH?

Many of the instructions for obtaining a visa and residence permit (only for non-EEA nationals), or any other documents needed while staying in Hungary, can be found on our website: BTK.ELTE.HU/EN.

However, we strongly recommend that you should always inquire with the Hungarian authorities in order to make sure that you have the latest and most up-to-date information.

The National Directorate-General for Aliens Policing (OIF) is responsible for most procedures that non-Hungarian nationals have to follow when they wish to study in Hungary.
